We've struck gold!!

We are very excited to announce that Ringwood Day Nursery has recently received accreditation from the National Day Nurseries Association (NDNA) Quality Counts. We have been awarded a level 3 gold award and recognised as 'Investors in Children'. Out of all the nurseries registered with the NDNA only 15 % have achieved this level of award and we are the only nursery in Hampshire with this level of award.

To complete this accreditation we have been evaluating and implementing improvements to enable us to achieve quality throughout every aspect of the setting - from management structure to early education practice. Achieving accreditation demonstrates that we are committed to a continuous process of evaluation and reflective practice that will challenge, support and develop the setting and enhance the service we deliver.

Quality Counts marks a childcare provider out as special. It builds upon the unique provision each setting provides, while ensuring each one has at its heart the same underlying ethos of commitment to families, staff, the community and above all, the child.

Pathfinder scheme

By 2010 the government wishes to implement changes to the entitlement of free nursery education. But as with all new things, they want to test it out first with a few settings. Ringwood Day Nursery has agreed to give it a go!

So what does it mean? Those children aged 3 years and over are now entitled to claim up to 15 hours a week of Education Grant, increasing from the original 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours over 38 weeks a year (therefore during term times only). For you this means an extra £9 per week of free education, if you take up the full 15 hours. It may be possible to increase the time that some children attend the nursery in order to take advantage of the new entitlement.

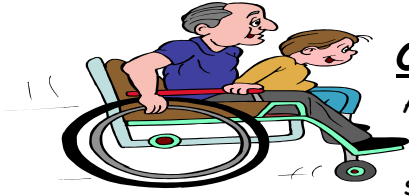
