We made the most of the end of summer with lots of time in the garden. We loved playing in our splash pad which kept the children nice and cool!




Cherry room have been particularly interested in animals lately, so there has been lots of play opportunities created with different animals. There has been farm set ups and wild animal messy play trays of offer. The children have been able to explore these with the



different animals. They have been encouraging the children to identify the animals and make the different animal sounds,



As the season has changed, we have been making some autumn crafts. The children have used autumnal coloured tissue paper to make their autumn leaf suncatcher. We have also started to make pictures for our autumn display.



Pear Room...



Pear Room have been embracing the early signs of Autumn and started to explore a variety of autumnal activities. They have mixed autumnal coloured paints, greens, red and yellow to see what other colours they could make. This mostly resulted in autumnal brown!!

They have also started making some pumpkins ready for their Autumn display.

The children in big Pear room continue to enjoy the activities set up in their 'finger gym'. They are particularly enjoying the popper toys. These are providing plenty of mathematical learning opportunities, talking about shapes, colours, numbers and sizes.



Children in Little Pear have loved making their own playdough, using the spoon to scoop the ingredients and choosing what colour they would like. Once it was made, they used rolling pins and cutters as well as their hands to manipulate the playdough in different ways.



Oak Room...

Oak room have been playing lots of turn taking games. They have particularly enjoyed the fishing game and the pairs game.

The children have been making lots of narks and



patterns. They have been using the matchsticks to use these to match the patterns on the table. They have been able to talk about the shapes they can see and problem solve by working out where they can place the sticks to make the shape. They have been able to participate in this activity both individually, as well as working on it together with their friends.

They have also been playing lots of other shape games and puzzles which they have enjoyed.



The children have been using the puppets at group times to act out stories, and talk about different emotions. The children have then been able to explore using the puppets in their own way during their play.

The children always enjoy seeing what's on offer in the sensory tray, they have recently been able to explore lemons, limes, and oranges- this smelt lovely! They have then been talking about floating and sinking whilst exploring the water tray with corks and buttons in it.




Pre School...
