Cherry room have celebrated lots of lovely traditions this month and have enjoyed some pancake day craft! The children have decorated paper plates and made a pancake collage of their favourite toppings!

As usual our babies have enjoyed lots of lovely new sensory experiences, recently they

have been exploring soft and hard objects. The staff have offered the children baskets of soft and hard objects to explore, the children were encouraged to explore the objects, to touch and feel them in their hands and against their face. The staff would ask questions and prompt new words to extend their vocabulary; 'is it soft' 'is it bumpy'.





Pear room

This month in pear room he children have been exploring the hungry

caterpillar story, they have read the story during circle time and used the story sacks to explore the puppets and props for

the story. Using visual aids during story time really

helps bring the story to life and encourages the children to take an active roll at story time. The children have then made their own giant hungry caterpillar for the display board as well as making and decorating the food he ate during the story!


Pear room have also been practising their fine motor skills, the staff have set up cubes with spaghetti in to act as

a base and have encouraged the children to thread cheerios onto the spaghetti. This activity is great for practising their pincer group as well as their hand-eye co-ordination!

As part of celebrating Valentine's day the children in pear room have taken part in some lovely activities, they have explored valentine's playdough, using cutters and

utensils to make and mould shapes. They also made valentine's cards for their loved ones at home, using tissue paper and glue to make a heart shaped collage!

Staff also covered the floor in paper and encouraged drawing





demonstrating heart shapes and encouraged the children to colour them in and copy the marks.

It was Pancake Day and in Oak room the children listened to a pancake story during circle time.





Pre-school

In January we celebrated Chinese new year, the children in pre-school loved exploring the role play area that was set up as a Chinese restaurant! The children practiced their fine motor skills using their chop sticks to eat their Chinese lunch

and they also practised

copying Chinese letters and symbols.



It was very cold when we came back in January and the children all loved exploring how the cold weather affected the garden, the children saw

frozen spiders webs and the frozen water in the mud kitchen. Tracy and Amanda brought the ice inside and the

children enjoyed looking through the ice and how the ice is distorted when cracked and melting. Tracy discussed with the children how water changes when cold.



Pre-school have also been looking at forming patterns with the natural resources. The children have been using our natural resources area to form different patterns and to make shapes, they have also been using the larger resources to create floor patterns and using them to walk along. Tracy and Amanda have been promoting their physical

development and their maths skills using these activities.
