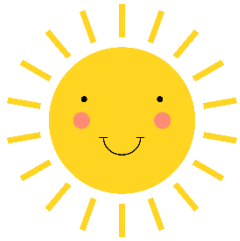


Ringwood Day Nursery

Cherry room have been focusing on sharing and turn taking; we have been using lots of scooping and pouring sensory trays to practice working together and sharing a task!

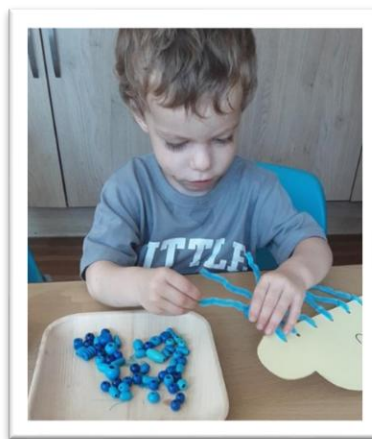
The children have also been exploring our new garden equipment; balancing on our tyre walkway and climbing up and over our wooden bridge!
